Our production makes up roughly 20% of all U.S. potato production. Water delivered to this region is critical for our ability to continue to supply food both domestically and internationally.

The effort to continue phased development of the Congressionally authorized Columbia Basin Project, which today, is responsible for over \$5 billion in annual, cumulative economic activity is critical for rural Washington State.
