1. The *Tax Cuts and Jobs Act* nearly doubles the standard deduction to \$12,000 for individuals and \$24,000 for families, which will allow more filers to take the standard deduction
2. The *Tax Cuts and Jobs Act* enhances the Child Tax Credit to \$2,000 per child dependent, including an increase of the refundable portion of the credit to \$1,400 further helping lower income families, and creates a new credit of \$500 for each non-child dependent, providing more tax relief for families who care for loved ones besides their children
3. Of the filers that paid the individual mandate penalty, 89% of those taxpayers in WA-04 earned less than \$75,000 annually, disproportionately affecting middle and lower income families
