Dear Speaker Boehner, Leader McCarthy, and Whip Scalise:

The undersigned Members of the Republican Study Committee (RSC) are writing to respectfully request that you schedule a vote on full repeal of Obamacare before February 13, 2015, when the House takes its first recess of the year.

As you know, the American people have entrusted House Republicans with their largest majority since the election of 1928. 
